

Dear people of Marseille, dear visitors,

Forever the first! It will be historic: Marseille, the first city in France and the first in French football, will become the first place in the world to welcome the Olympic flame by sea. 2600 years after our city was founded and 3000 years after the first Olympic Games, the flame will cross the Mediterranean Sea and arrive at our beloved Vieux Port. It was at this very spot, when the port was still just a natural cove, that Greek sailors from Phocaea arrived and became the first inhabitants of Marseille by choosing this location to build a great seaside capital.

We are going to experience an extraordinary moment together. After the visit of Pope François in 2023, Marseille

will once again be the centre of the world's attention. All eyes will be on this city of singular beauty, this city that fills us with so much pride and gives us such tremendous freedom. We're going to show the world the strength of our millennia-old city that built its existence upon the values that we share with the Olympics: diversity, solidarity, and fraternity.

Marseille is radiant, it is a beacon of light for the Mediterranean, a beacon of light for the five continents. We are reclaiming our place as a global capital. I want this to be a time for festivities, a time for sharing, a celebration for the people of Marseille and our visitors. The festivities will last from morning until night and we will embrace this epic event together on the quays of our Vieux Port and on the terraces of our cafés, under the warm Marseille sun that shines upon all the accents of the world. Let us enjoy this time, let us savour this groundbreaking moment. Marseille is thriving and Marseille is resplendent.

8 MAY 2024 THE ARRIVAL OF THE OLYMPIC FLAME

After 12 days at sea, the *Belem* will arrive in Marseille with the Olympic flame on May 8th. It will be a historic and exceptional moment for everyone to enjoy together.

The Vieux Port becomes a pedestrian zone and festivities start at 11h

The City of Marseille has planned an array of events and activities to make this an unforgettable day. There will be exhibitions, photobooths, an escape game, a DJ set, dancing, wheelchair basketball, freestyle football, and musical entertainment that will thrill the young and old alike. Shops and restaurants will remain open and there will be giant screens showing the arrival of the Olympic flame.

11h Arrival of the Belem in the Bay of Marseille

The 19th-century three-masted ship will enter the Bay of Marseille with the Olympic flame.

11h/17h Sea parade

Nearly a thousand boats are expected to welcome the *Belem* and accompany its journey around the Bay of Marseille. The boats will pass as close to the coast as possible so that everyone can enjoy the spectacle.

19h Arrival of the *Belem* in the Vieux Port

The Olympic flame will be greeted at the port with a sensational welcome ceremony.


19h40 The lighting of the Olympic cauldron

This historic moment will take place in front of tens of thousands of spectators at the Vieux Port and millions more people around the world will watch the event on television or streaming. It will mark the official launch of the Olympic Torch Relay in France.

The festivities will conclude with a free concert by Alonzo and Soprano so everybody can celebrate the arrival of the Olympic flame at the Vieux Port together.

9 MAY 2024 THE OLYMPIC FLAME RELAY

Hundreds of runners, including many renowned figures from Marseille, will take turns carrying the Olympic flame. The official route goes past numerous iconic locations and follows a path that takes it to the four corners of Marseille to ensure that all the people of the city will have a chance to see and celebrate the Olympic flame.

THE ROUTE

Notre-Dame de la Garde to Estrangin The Olympic flame will head for Place Estrangin via Boulevard Vauban and Rue Breteuil. It will arrive at its destination after a 2.2-km run.

Departure: 8h20 Arrival: 9h05

2 Parc Borély to Palais du Pharo

The relay will start from the Corniche Kennedy and cover 6.25 km until it reaches the Palais du Pharo.

Departure: 9h20 Arrival: 11h

3 Lettres Marseille

There will be a 500-metre run around the MARSEILLE sign from 11h10 to 11h20.

4 Palais du Pharo to Arenc

Heading towards Arenc via the Vieux Port, the Olympic flame will pass in front of the City Hall and then continue along the Boulevard Jacques Saadé and the Quai du Lazaret.

A 6.3-km route.

Departure: 11h40

Arrival: 13h15

5 Parc de Font Obscure

There will be two loops run through the park between 14h10 and 14h30.

6 Dôme to Palais Longchamp

Leaving from the Dôme and then travelling along Boulevard Françoise-Duparc (Jarret), this stage will cover a total distance of 3 km.

Departure: 15h30 Arrival: 16h20

7 Parc de La Moline

There will be two loops run through the park between 16h45 and 17h05.

8 Périer-Mazargues

For this final stage, the flame will set off from Avenue du Prado towards Boulevard Michelet. It will arrive at the Vélodrome stadium for the lighting of the Olympic cauldron on the Esplanade Ganay.

Departure: 17h40 Arrival: 19h20

9 MAY 2024 ACTIVITIES & EVENTS ACROSS THE ENTIRE CITY

Throughout the day, the district town halls will be organising events to ensure that the people of Marseille can enjoy a full menu of public festivities to mark the start of the Olympic Torch Relay.

Town hall - 2nd & 3rd arrondissements



Capoeira, giant chess, zumba, and games for the whole family. Food and drink will be available on-site.

The flame will arrive at 11h45.

Town hall - 4th & 5th arrondissements

Parc Longchamp Starting at 13h

Wooden games, exhibitions, a chance to learn more about historical figures, diverse theatrical activities, and a massive treasure hunt with sporting challenges. The flame will arrive at 16h20.

Town hall - 6th & 8th arrondissements

Parc Borély Starting at 9h30

Introduction to Nordic walking, boxing, rollerblading, a Basket Santé accessible basketball game, giant tennis, Indian dance exhibition, and juggling shows. Musical entertainment will be provided by a bicycle-driven float and DJ Solaire. The flame will arrive at 9h20.

Town hall - 9th & 10th arrondissements

Obélisque de Mazargues Between 18h and 19h

Performances by the Cheerdance Leader dance team and the Treize en Portée batucada drum group with activities organised by a range of local sports clubs and cultural organisations.

The flame will arrive at 18h30.

Town hall - 11th & 12th arrondissements



An Olympic Village organised in partnership with sports associations in the area. Savate (French boxing), boxing, archery, medieval fencing, taekwondo, rugby, breakdancing, etc.

The flame will arrive at 16h45.

Town hall - 13th & 14th arrondissements



Discover a range of different sports with the help of coaches and even some local champions, graffiti workshop, recycling awareness activities, breakdancing, an urban trail, stilt walkers, demonstrations by professional skateboarders, and musical entertainment.

The flame will arrive at 14h10.

Town hall - 15th & 16th arrondissements



Food stalls and sports activities such as a mobile climbing wall, double-dutch jump rope, and scooters. A large screen will let people follow events and there will be a surprise entertainment event.

A DAY OF FESTIVITIES Starting at 13h30

A carousel built by the Sud Side workshops with residents from 20 neighbourhoods will showcase local sports and heritage.

FLAGS UP Starting at 14h30

A parade of flags created by the people of Marseille.

To prepare for the Olympic flame, from May 2nd to 5th, Marseille is organising a week of sports-related events in many different neighbourhoods. Young people will be able to discover projects developed with cultural and artistic associations. More than 10 000 children and numerous schools are participating.

What's on the programme? Circus, theatre, cinema, photography, music, dance, workshops, artist residencies, street performances, graphic design, sporting activities... The Cultural Olympiad showcases Marseille's vibrant creative scene and the dynamic spirit that resulted in it being awarded the official "Active and Sporting City" designation.
